

July 4th Activities for Preschoolers

Independence Day is almost here, and kids often want to get creative with their celebrations. This year, give them ways to stay busy while also teaching them about diversity, science, math, and art at the same time! Here's a list of fun and educational 4th of July crafts and activities for kids.

1. Create fireworks in a jar

Water-filled mason jar with drops of food coloring sinking. All you need is a jar, water, oil, and food coloring to watch these fireworks take flight.

2. Read a book

Book Blue Sky White Stars on table and interior pages of book with fireworks illustrations and text that says, "Red, White, Boom!"

The story of America is intertwined with immigration and refugees. Teach your kids about the refugee experience with one of these amazing books or one of these picture books to teach kids more about the 4th of July.

3. Watch a 4th of July science video

4. Make star-spangled art

7. Sign your own declaration
